We're closing in on the end of another year, and the Association has just a couple events left before the New Year. Our December General Membership meeting and the event at the Soaring Eagle Casino.

As you may know, the Association has taken legal action against the State of Michigan over a Budget issue that made 10 Million dollars "As Written" available to "Healthcare VEBAs, that were established in a Bankruptcy from the City of Detroit. The State did not allow our Healthcare VEBA, that was established during the Bankruptcy for Police and Fire Retirees that were retired on or before December 31, 2014. We were notified by our Attorneys that we may have some hearing on the Lawsuit in November, but the issue is far from being completed. We will keep you updated dates as we work through the legal system.

This is also an election year which includes a Presidential election. So most of the State and Federal legislators are out campaigning for their elections, so there isn't much going on as far as legislation in the State or at the Federal level.

Once again the issue of the Social Security Windfall and Pension Offset is back in front of the Legislators in Washington. The legislation has the same Bill number as it did two year ago (H.R. 82). Once again this piece of legislation has gained more than the required 290 co-sponsors which could force

action in the US House of Representative. Currently there are 329 co-sponsors, 210 Democratic, and 119 Republican. All the Democratic Representatives from Michigan are co-sponsors, and one Republican (John James). We have sent letters to all the Republican Representatives in Michigan on this issue, requesting their support, but have not received any responses.

We will continue to follow the legislation, but as for this legislation ever becoming Law, there is very little likelihood of that. This issue has been in front of the Legislators for over 40 years. The new House Rules regarding legislation with 290 or more Co-sponsors this year which is the same as it was two years ago when the same legislation had more than 290 co-sponsors. The action by the Full House is required if the Committee that has been assigned the Legislation does not take any action to report the Legislation. As you recall two years ago the Ways and Means Committee met and reported the Legislation without a recommendation. This removed the requirement for action by the full House. The same thing or some other trickery is likely to happen on this years legislation. But we will continue to monitor and hope that this time it does move through the systems.

That's it for now, don't forget to Vote, and hopefully we'll see you at the Association events.

I hope everyone is doing well and you enjoyed the summer months with your family and friends. That means that fall is here and the holidays are right around the corner. With that in mind just a reminder that the General Meetings began with the first on the west side at American Legion Stitt Post, which was well attended. The next will be the December meeting, which will be held at the Polish Century Club on the 5th of the month. The March meeting will be back at the American Legion Stitt Post on the 6th and the May meeting is back at the Polish Century Club on the 1st.

I'm not sure if this will reach everyone in time, but the RDPFFA is having a function at the Soaring Eagle Casino & Resort in Mt. Pleasant on November 3rd & 4th. For those who have already registered we look forward to seeing you.

Again next year the Association will be having the annual picnic and June General Meeting in Frankenmuth at the Bavarian Inn, the dates will be June 22-24, 2025. The picnic will be held on Monday the 23rd and the meeting on Tuesday the 24th and naturally the hospitality rooms will be on Sunday and Monday evenings. There will be more information available in the months to come, just wanted to get the dates out there for those busy calendars.

Moving on with the Pension System updates. The City made their annual contribution to the system which was required after a 10 year absence because of the

bankruptcy ruling where the Foundation contributed the 18.3 million annually for those 10 years. The roughly 83 million was sent to the system by the due date. Also, the City is planning on making quarterly contributions to the system versus once annually. These required contributions will assist the Pension System in making their monthly payments of approximately 23 million dollars to those of us still around to receive our monthly checks. As of the end of September, the Pension System's assets were approximately 2.8 billion, so our pension system is in good shape at this time.

Now, for those of you who were not at the October meeting or did not see the video of the meeting, the talk of a 13th check has resurfaced and it appears it may happen. Don't get too excited and plan on that cruise or trip to Las Vegas, unless you own a large boat or live near Las Vegas. In the City of Detroit budget, 10 million dollars was budgeted for retirees, 5 million to the General System and 5 million to the Police & Fire System. Although, as of this writing, the City Council has yet to approve the budget but they do expect them to do so.

The bottom line is, the 5 million will be divided between all recipients of the system. This is where the issue of how it is divided comes into play. They want to do it fairly so they are looking into taking the total number of years actually worked and dividing that number of years into the 5 million. They feel that those that may have only worked say 10 or 15 years whether it was that retiree vested or went off on disability. They plan on having a payment method figured out, hopefully, by the time the December 13th check will be distributed. I will allow you to do the math because it is way over my head. For those that want to make an attempt, there are around 8000 retirees and beneficiaries receiving pensions. If we hear of anything new or any updates we will get the information out there.



# DEATH OF MEMBER FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROCEDURE

Communications vary whether member was Police, Fire, or Sergeant and above. If you are Police make your first call to the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association, (313) 870-9304. Followed by either a call to the Detroit Police Officer Association, (313) 567-8770, or the Lieutenants & Sergeants (313) 961-5699, which ever applies.

While the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association will normally contact the City of Detroit with the information it would be reasonable to follow up with a call to the Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 Ext. 221 or 1 (800) 339-8344 and BeneSys (833) 725-5336 to make sure that they were notified. Last but not least, notify the Retired Detroit Police & Fire Fighters Association, (586) 795-1734.

Fire employees, start by notifying the Detroit Fire Fighter Association, (313) 962-7546, the Detroit Firemen's Fund Association, (313) 628-0099, Detroit Fire Mutual Fund call Firemen's Fund Association to leave a message, and the Detroit Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 or (800) 339-8344, ext 221.

The above agencies will assist you with the notification process. It would be a good idea to put this information with your secured legal documents or some other obvious place where your survivors can locate it.
