



Winter just seems to hang around with cool temperatures, but I have seen a few plants starting to sprout which makes me look forward to the warmer days of spring.

The Association has returned to our pre-covid schedule of events. The Association has now found a new location for Westside general meetings at The American Legion Stitt Post 232 at 23850 Military. We held our first meeting there on April 7th. It was pretty well attended, considering the short notice which was given out. Our next general meeting is on May 5th, and will be held back at the eastside location, American Polish Century Club on Maple Lane in Sterling Heights. We also have an event at the Firekeepers Casino in Battle Creek on May 1-3. Once again we are returning to Frankenmuth for our June Meeting and annual picnic June 19-21. The Golf outing is August 12th at the Oak Ridge Golf Club.

The Association membership has seen a fairly rapid change in the last several years. Since reaching a total membership of just under 7000 in 2013, the total membership today has fallen to 4959. We have seen a continuing aging of the membership. Currently we have 457 members over the age of 90, and just 574 under the age of 65. There are a number of reasons for the decline in membership, one major one is that the


make-up of the active roles have been cut by more than 50%, very few new retirees (2 or 3 a month on average) are joining the Association, and there are approximately 30 member deaths per month.

There are a large number on non-members, and we continue to attempt to convince them to join, with little success. One example of how difficult it is to get any movement of non-members to join is: When our Association pushed for the passage of HB 4396 which became Public Act 149 of 2017, this was a pension tax Bill which gave a tax deduction to those that retired from a City / Municipality that did not participate in Social Security, and were born after 1952. This legislation would save those affected by it between \$600 to \$1200 a year on their State Income Tax. Over 500 nonmembers benefited from this legislation. Our Association sent each one of them a letter advising them of the legislation, and requesting they join the Association. Less than 30 responded and joined the Association. So there is little doubt that the Association membership will continue its decline.

We continue monitoring Michigan legislation that may have an effect on our members. Recently the legislators passed Pension Tax legislation that would improve the deductions for all retirees, and legislation to suspend the state gas tax, but both pieces of legislation was vetoed by the Governor. The state has a 2.7 billion dollar surplus in Federal funds and another 2.7 in general funds, so both the legislators and the Governor's office say they will continue to look for tax reduction that all parties can agree on. This is an election year so it is likely that they will come up with some agreement.

On the Federal level, there hasn't been any movement on any legislation that would improve our bene-

The topic is constantly monitored. Even though financially we are not facing an immediate danger the concern cannot be ignored! The Association's assets are professionally managed and reinforced by the present dues paying members and appreciation contributors.

The new membership is the ongoing problem confronting the Association. It's simple, our group is getting older and expected new members are not joining!

Below are two illustrations showing membership annual loses and the Association's new membership additions.

As illustrated by the charts below, the membership numbers are not trending well. Consequently, the need for all members to assist the Association in recruiting new membership will be welcomed.


