We've made it through another Michigan winter, but this one was relatively mild, and now it's time for to make plans for our scheduled summer events. The Association has a number of events scheduled for the summer which include; Frankenmuth General meeting and picnic on June 26 & 27, RDPFFA Golf Outing August 11 and in the autumn, Firekeepers Nov 5 & 6, hope to see you there.

Legislation:

The Association had another major legislative victory, when we were able to amend the Michigan Pension Tax legislation. House Bill 4001 was signed into law by the Governor on March 7, 2023. This law eliminates the state pension tax, but is phased in over 4 years for everyone except for Retired Police and Fire Fighters. The law goes into full effect for Police and Fire retirees starting with calendar year 2023. The new law allows you to select the New Pension Tax law or stay with the current law. You will need to study this new law to see which one gives you the greatest benefit. Under the old law you were given a deduction of 35 thousand single and 55 thousand on a joint return, and once you turned 67 years old the deduction could be used on any income not just retirement. Under the new

law there is no limit for Police or Fire on amount of deduction, but it does not include any income after age 67. It will be important that when you do your taxes next year you make sure that whoever you have doing your taxes is familiar with the Tax laws and the way they effect Police and Fire Retirees, because Police and Fire are the only ones treated differently under both Pension Tax versions.

Our Association is also continuing to work on legislation regarding the Open Meeting Act. The legislation would allow some flexibility for Trustees of Pension Board & VEBA Board to still be able to participate and vote in meetings that they are unable to attend in person. We will also be following any other legislation that may have either a positive or negative effect on our members.

On the Federal level, once again legislation has been introduced to eliminate the Social Security Windfall and Pension Offset. With all the trickery that the members of the Ways and Means Committee did last legislative session, I wouldn't get overly excited about this legislation becoming law. Strangely the new legislation has the same bill number as was used in the last session. The current bill number is H.R. 82- Social Security Act of 2023 and currently has 210 co-sponsors. There are currently no co-sponsors from Michigan. As you may recall if the legislation receives 290 or more co-sponsors and the Ways and Means Committee has not taken any action, it could require a full vote by the House of Representatives, but don't hold your breath. Just maybe after 50 years of trying, something might happen to get the Act changed.


