As we move into the warmer summer months, many of us are likely to see a little brighter future, because some of us have received our retroactive funds from the overturning of Social Security Windfall and Pension Offset provisions. The first Social Security checks with the new amounts are due in the April checks.

If you haven't received any update from Social Security, you should contact your local office to see if you qualify. The Social Security web-site last update shows that those retirees that have a complicated issue will take longer. They expect to have these cases completed by early November. Once again if you haven't received any information from Social Security you should take the time to check with your local office.

We continue to wait for a decision on our court case against the State of Michigan. The motion by the State was heard on January 22nd. The Judge said that it would take him some time to release a decision; we didn't think it would take this long. Just to refresh you regarding this case, it is in reference to \$10 million dollars the State put into the budget for Healthcare VEBAs formed during a bankruptcy, and we believe we qualified for some of those funds. As with all court cases this is going to take time, so far it's taken even longer than we thought to resolve it.

Not much else going on, the state legislators haven't been doing much, other than working on the next budget. We are also waiting for our 13th check that the City said they were going to give to retirees. Hopefully you'll have that check by the time you get this article. I'm sure, like me, you're waiting and hoping for the stock market to start going back in an upward direction.

Our summer events are all scheduled re: The Picnic and Breakfast General meeting in Frankenmuth and our Golf Outing also make sure to check our Association Calendar of Events and the Upcoming Special events page in this Unity so you can make arrangements to attend some of the functions.

In past articles I've presented many facts and figures. In this article I would like to digress and present a human interest story that was sent to me by Associate Member Mary Cassidy.

The following is an article from The Detroit News Picture Page – Wednesday, July 21, 1965 By Doc Greene

How Pull Helps Out If You're a Cop

The man on the phone said. "Well, he's out sitting with a dead man right now but he has to be back here by noon in time to leave, could I have him call you when he gets in?"

The guy on the phone was answering from Precinct 7 and it was Pat Cassidy sitting with the deceased.

This was vesterday morning.

At about the same time Big Tom Cibulka, six feet eight and 272 pounds of him, was walking around under Woodward on what they call the "white hat" beat and a kid who had figured the fare wrong didn't have enough dough for a ticket on the Bob-Lo excursion.

"I don't have enough" said the kid among a tear. Tom doesn't give away a lot of money every week but everybody knows that a man is nothing but an aged boy, so what can you do?

John Serocki was riding his three—wheel motorbike along Charlevoix in front of the Budd Wheel plant and wrote four parking tickets, then came downtown to tackle the rush hour traffic.

Ed Riley was working a car out of Precinct 13 and spent a portion of his morning helping strap up a psychopath for delivery to Receiving Hospital.

Relatives had called for the city physician, who committed the woman. Riley helped deliver her.

Jerry Farrell and the other guy in the No. 3 out of 16, recovered a stolen car.

"It was sitting there, parked funny and with all the windows open and we checked it and it was a hot car." He was explaining later.

This must be what policemen do when they're not being brutal to people is a thought.

A Salesman Gone Right

Carl Gabrys was working a car but it was Dullsville yesterday morning . . . no runs.

Ron Fournier was operating a two wheel bike and gave a ticket to a guy on Jefferson doing 50 in a 35 mph zone. Tom Costello spent the morning selling Policemen's Field Day tickets.

"I sold 12," he said.

Tom used to be salesmen before he went straight.

"Some days you sell 40. This morning I sold 12. It depends on when payday is and maybe how they feel and I feel and like that."

Here now was the police tug o'war team practicing for the pull against Toronto across second base at Tiger Stadium on the Sunday that is Aug. 1 this year.

`A trick that Works`

"No" said Raleigh. "They're low and set and braced and a team would wear themselves out tryin'. It's a trick we have. It works."

He moves the team like a crew coxswain except that he stands alongside. He does it by hand signals.

"It's OK. But in Texas we use mules for this kind of thing."

Communications vary whether member was Police, Fire, or Sergeant and above. If you are Police make your first call to the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association, (313) 870-9304. Followed by either a call to the Detroit Police Officer Association, (313) 567-8770, or the Lieutenants & Sergeants (313) 961-5699, which ever applies.

While the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association will normally contact the City of Detroit with the information it would be reasonable to follow up with a call to the Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 Ext. 221 or 1 (800) 339-8344 and BeneSys (833) 725-5336 to make sure that they were notified. Last but not least, notify the Retired Detroit Police & Fire Fighters Association, (586) 795-1734.

Fire employees, start by notifying the Detroit Fire Fighter Association, (313) 962-7546, the Detroit Firemen's Fund Association, (313) 628-0099, Detroit Fire Mutual Fund call Firemen's Fund Association to leave a message, and the Detroit Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 or (800) 339-8344, ext 221.

The above agencies will assist you with the notification process. It would be a good idea to put this information with your secured legal documents or some other obvious place where your survivors can locate it.






