Summer has arrived, and finally the Covid restrictions are disappearing. Now it is time to start to return to some resemblance of a normal lifestyle. The Association has scheduled General Membership meetings starting in September, Golf Outing in August, and we just held the annual Picnic in Frankenmuth. Hopefully many of you are ready to get back out and once again start attending the Association events and socializing with fellow members.

This copy of the Unity includes an article and information (page 4) regarding an extraordinary gift the Association received from the Cowell Family Trust. This was given in honor of Division Commander Donald M. Cowell. To date the Association has received \$385,000.00 (Three Hundred eighty five thousand) from the Cowell Family Trust. The Trust currently is holding \$102,152.64 in reserve, once final administration expenses and other cost have been paid, the Association will receive a portion of the remaining balance.

It has always been the practice of the Association not to publicize the amount of the donations and gifts given by our members, but I think you will agree this was an exceptional gift which made it necessary to include the amount in order to properly give the recognition such an extraordinary gesture deserves.


The RDPFFA has the most faithful and generous members of any organization. We recognize that many of our members have very limited resources, yet hundreds of our members send in regular donations. Some make regular monthly donations, others send donations whenever they can, some of these donations are very substantial. Regardless of the size of the donations, all are very much appreciated and needed.

The Association annual expenses are approximately \$250,000 a year. The dues bring in around \$180,000 leaving a shortfall of approximately \$70,000. This shortfall is covered by member donations and interest from investments. Over the past 10 years the generosity of our membership has resulted in over \$468,233.00 in donations being made.

Again, I want to stress that we realize the limits that many of our members have when it comes to expendable income they have after paying for normal living expenses. I hope you understand why the Association treated the recognition of this gift differently. We also appreciate and need the support of our membership in order to provide the services and representation that our association provides.

The Association continues to monitor legislation on both State and Federal level. In Lansing there are a number of pieces of legislation we are monitoring. They includes Bills that would allow for the issuing and renewing your CCW in any Michigan County, remove the income limit for those on Duty Disabilities, add COLA to the allotted amount of deduction from income on your State Tax. These are just a few of the Bills in Lansing relating to CCW and Pension Tax. A few of these Bills have had committee hearings, and were approval at the committee level and sent to the

With the covid restrictions being lifted the Association will get the monthly meetings back on the schedule beginning with the September 2, 2021 meeting which will be held at the Polish Century Club. It is hard to believe that we are nearly ten years from the city of Detroit filing for Chapter 9 bankruptcy on July 18, 2013. It was the largest municipal bankruptcy filing in U.S. history by debt, estimated at \$18-20 billion.

Unfamiliar times continue with the COVID-19, an ongoing global pandemic of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID 19), which is caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), one of the deadliest pandemics in history. (December 2019 – present)

For your information and the Associations benefit, it is important that when your summer/winter address changes, we are notified in advance of the move and again when you are returning to your home address. That way we can keep you current. We don't want to lose you in the process.

Where did this come from? It's simply my thoughts responding to people I talk to who are bitter with the city over bankruptcy, angry as well as frustrated with events in general. Happiness and freedom begin with a clear understanding of one principle. Some things are within our control, and some things are not.

Moving from the above-mentioned occurrences and focusing on what we can control is the future of the Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighters Association. Right now the organization is principally and financially secure even though the membership is steadily in decline and recruiting new members is at a standstill. The Officers and the Board of Directors welcome suggestions from our members for ways to create interest to have non-members join.

The RDPFFA conducts eight (8) General Membership meetings starting in March, continuing in April, May, June, September, October, November and December. The attending members are provided with information regarding the monthly activities of the Association as well as providing food and beverages before and during the event.

The thirty six dollar (\$36.00), annual membership fee is a small payment to enjoy the security, knowing that the Association is continually keeping an eye on events that could affect members earned benefits. Information concerning the status of Pensions, Hospitalization and Insurances are communicated to the membership through our "Unity", a quarterly magazine; additionally members are informed with updates sent out through our Homepage at rdpffa.org as well as messages to our members through Constant Contact, an email marketing company.

REMEMBRANCE AND THANK YOU

On April 15, 1993 DPD Deputy Chief Donald Cowell and Jane Cowell established The Cowell Family Trust and named The Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighter Association as a residual beneficiary of the Trust.

With the passing of Donald's spouse, Jane, on December 6, 2020, the Trust became irrevocable. Upon notification by the Trustees of the Trust, the funds were to be disbursed to the beneficiares.

As mentioned in President Don Taylor's article, the Association's policy is not to publicize the amount of donations. However, we felt it important to share and recognize this extraordinary gift and to publicly thank the Cowell Family for considering the Association in their estate planning.

The Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighters Association is a beneficiary of the Trust. We received a partial distribution dated April 15, 2021 in the amount of One Hundred, Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000). A second distribution dated June 24, 2021 was received in the amount of Two Hundred, Sixty thousand dollars (\$260,000).

I'm sure you will agree that by including the Association in their trust with this generous gift, Deputy Chief Cowell and his family had a heartfelt respect for his fellow retirees and this Association. Again, we thank the Cowell family for your consideration and generousity!





FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROCEDURE

Communications vary whether the member was Police, Fire, or Sergeant and above. If you are Police, make your first call to the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association, (313) 870-9304. Followed by either a call to the Detroit Police Officer Association, (313) 567-8770, or the Lieutenants & Sergeants (313) 961-5699, which ever applies.

While the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association will normally contact the City of Detroit with the information, it would be reasonable to follow up with a call to the Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 or 1 (800) 339-8344 and BeneSys at (833) 725-5336 to make sure that they were notified. Last but not least, notify the Retired Detroit Police & Fire Fighters Association at (586) 795-1734.

Fire employees, start by notifying the Detroit Fire Fighter Association, (313) 962-7546, the Detroit Firemen's Fund Association and Detroit Fire Mutual Fund, (313) 628-0099, and the Police and Fire Retirement System (PFRS), (313) 224-3362 or 1 (800) 339-8344, extension 221.

The above agencies will assist you with the notification process. It would be a good idea to put this information with your secured legal documents or some other obvious place where your survivors can locate it.

Biden Tax Plan: Change a Few Numbers. Raise Taxes by Trillions


There are some significant tax increases proposed by the Biden Administration (and Congress as well). It's incredible the way changing a number or two increases taxes dramatically, and also changes policy setting off a chain reaction of cascading outcomes. Caveat emptor: Draw your own conclusions about whether tax increases are good or evil. This discussion is focused only on possible outcomes.

Change an '8' to a '1' and Raise Over \$1 trillion. One piece of the tax proposal is to raise the corporate income tax from 21% to 28% on 'C' corporations. At first blush this would seem to affect big companies, and it will. Estimates vary, but a tax increase to 28% will affect S&P 500 earnings negatively, possibly by as much as -6%. Lower profits mean investors will pay less for a stock.

Big companies with profits pay more taxes, but there are only about 3,671 publicly traded companies (in 2020) versus about 23 million private businesses. According to Ashley Wilson, chief tax lobbyist of the US Chamber the tax year, stull-time students under the age of 24 at the end of the year, or permanently and totally disabled at any time during the year, as well as qualifying relatives such as aging parents that a taxpayer might bed supporting. Compared to income phaseout thresholds for payments made under the CCA and Coronavirus Aid, Relief, & Economic Security (CARES) Act, the AGI phaseout thresholds under the ARPA are lower, meaning that payments taper off faster (see the graph below). If you'll be receiving this additional stimulus payment and are considering options for how to use the funds, review our suggestions as outlined in our prior communication discussing the original stimulus payments authorized by the CARES Act. rporations (also named for an Internal Revenue Code subchapter). Do a quick survey on a drive and tally how many small businesses (LLC, PLLC, Inc.) you see. Most of them are pass-through, and virtually all would likely be affected by a tax increase.

The Tax Code needs to put both kinds of entities on parity, and therein lies the rub. If we tax C-corps at 28%, we need to allow pass-through owners to deduct 20% of their business income (called Qualified Business Income, or QBI). Otherwise, C-corps would have a lower tax rate. If we raise the corporate rate, the drafters of legislation would have to change the pass-through rules and lower the deduction. Hence, raising the corporate rate affects most small businesses.

The third level effect relates to competition. Of the G7 developed nations, the US has the 2nd lowest corporate tax rate.

If corporate rates increase to 28%, the U.S. moves up two spots to number four, on par with the current G7 average and higher than the average of the G20 (26.4%)

Change a '5' to a '1' and Upend Estate Planning. Of all the possible tax increases available, the easiest (and most obvious, probably) would be to change the expiration date of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA). The TCJA has multiple provisions that expire on 12/31/2025, due to the reconciliation process. Two notable pieces in the tax crosshairs are the maximum tax rate on ordinary income, going from 37% to 39.6% and the estate tax exclusion dropping from \$11.7 million to \$5.85 million. Change the expiration date to 12/31/21 and you raise taxes on high income and high asset families. The income tax increase is significant but not particularly consequential. The 37% rate starts at \$523,601 for single and \$628,301 for married, so it is hitting a rarefied group of taxpayers.

The estate tax change is more binary. If you tax \$5.85 million dollars at 40% (45% is proposed), the family of the decedent would be on the hook for about \$2.34 million. Married couples each get an exclusion, so they can pass \$23.4 million now and \$11.7 million after expiration. The issue presents itself for couples worth more than \$11.7 million or single people worth more than \$5.85 million, their heirs will pay more in taxes. \$5.8 million sounds like a lot and depending on your point of view, it is. However, a single person in California might have a house worth \$1.2 million (your basic CA starter home), a 401(k) or IRA worth \$1 million, \$1 million of investments and \$1 million of life insurance. They have about \$4.2 million, but if the assets grow by a modest 5%, in 20 years they'd be worth \$9.2 million and a portion of the estate would be taxable. Also, there is the small matter of California death taxes. Estate planning attorneys and advisors are seeing a huge rush in planning moves ahead of the change. Wayne Roberts, co-chief tax counsel of the Bodman law firm in Michigan observes "The reduction in the exclusion will create many more taxable estates, and an increase in the tax rate to 45% will exacerbate the economic effect for those who do not engage in strategic planning early. Clients are well advised to monitor legislative action regularly and begin to revise estate plans now. Even a minor delay could have a materially negative impact."

Bottom Line. Simple changes in tax law can have very big consequences. We don't know what tax increases, if any, may actually be enacted. We should note that the U.S. took on trillions in debt during the pandemic. Somebody always pays for it, and the simplest way for the government to increase revenue is through taxes. The correlation is difficult to ignore.


