I hope everyone is enjoying this nice summer weather. If you're like me, as I gotten older it seems like time just flies by and it won't be long before we are shoveling snow again. The Association has a number of events still coming up this year; including the Golf Outing on August 8, Soaring Eagle Casino on Nov 9 & 10, and the General Meetings Oct 2nd on the west side & Dec 4th on the east side. Mark your calendar and plan on attending, we would like to see you there.

Social Security Update: Many of us are still enjoying the increases we received on our Social Security with the passing of the Law eliminating both the Windfall and Pension Offset. During the Presidential campaign we all heard candidate Trump promising to eliminate Federal Tax on Social Security. Now with the new budget law passed in Congress, there were changes to retirees Social Security, but it did not eliminate all the Federal Tax for everyone. They did add an additional deduction amount of \$6,000 single and \$12,000 on joint return. I checked what my Federal Tax would have been this year with these new deductions, and it made of difference of \$1440.00. That's still pretty good, but it could have been better. The new deductions are only good for a few years, so hopefully they will extend these additional deductions before they expire.

We continue to wait for a decision on our court case against the State of Michigan. The motion by the State was heard on January 22nd. The Judge said that it would take him some time to release a decision. Just to refresh you regarding this case, it is in reference to \$10 million dollars the State put into the budget for Healthcare VEBAs formed during a bankruptcy, and we believe we qualified for some of those funds. As with all court cases this is going to take some time and so far it's taken even longer than we thought to resolve it.

Not much happening on the political front, as you know Michigan has split Government in Lansing with Democrats controlling the Senate and Republicans controlling the House, so not much is making it through the process. On the Federal level, we don't see anything that would have a major impact on us moving in Washington, so for the most part all is quiet and I guess that's good.

This is an Association election year and the information regarding the election is included in this copy of the Unity.

That's it for now, hopefully, we will see you around at the Association events.

Greetings all! I hope everyone is enjoying the summer months with family and friends. The Association Annual Picnic is over and all that attended seemed to have a great time, the weather sort of cooperated, no rain but it was a "little warm". It is always good to see so many friends and catch up.

Just a few updates for everyone, the Pension System is in fine shape and as always, the annual increases will take place on the August 1st checks. Old plan Police members will see a 4% increase and Fire retirees will see a 3% increase. Those under the Legacy Plan will see the normal 1.025%. You should have received the so called "13th check" in the May check. The City again placed a \$10,000,000 distribution in their new budget for retirees, 5 million for Police and Fire and 5 million for General retirees. The distribution has been approved by City Council and this time it is not necessary to get approval from the Bankruptcy Court. The actual date of the distribution has not been determined and when that happens we will let you know.

It appears the RDPFFA Annual Golf Outing scheduled for August 8th has filled up so it looks

like it is successful as usual. The Association General Meeting will start up again in October at the west side location and we again this year have a get together at Soaring Eagle Casino & Resort on November 9th & 10th with a Hospitality Room each evening. All the information can be found on our web site, RDPFFA.com along with all the Associations updates and information.

On the health care front for those who retired prior to January 1st 2015 the V.E.B.A. Board has again secured Priority Health as the insurance carrier for 2026 with all benefits remaining the same and a increase in the HRA and Medicare benefit. The Open Enrolment Package will be out in early fall for the opportunity to make any changes needed. Those retirees who retired after January 1st 2015 your benefits are handled by the active unions so any questions you may have give them a call.

That is all I have at this time so everyone continue to enjoy the remaining summer months with family and friends and if you have any questions or concerns please give the office a call. Just remember it is a whole different world out there so be vigilant and please be careful.

Notice of Retired Detroit Police and Firefighters Association Election

For the term in effect January 1, 2026 thru December 31, 2028

The following is information on all positions, duties and responsibilities.

President

Term – 3 years

Duties – Preside over General, Special & Board of Directors meetings. Sign all papers or checks requiring the President's signature. Appoint all Committees and Directors. Handle correspondence.

Secretary / Treasurer

Term – 3 years

Duties – 2nd in the line of succession
Keep correct records of all properties of the Association. Take and maintain minutes of meetings.

Vice President

Term – 3 years

Duties – 1st in line of succession
Assist with the operation of the Association.
Updating the Board of Directors regarding all local, state and federal ordinances.

Sergeant at Arms (2 each)

Term – 3 years

Duties – Preserve order at all meetings.
take names of members attending meetings.
Perform other duties prescribed by President/Board.

Trustees (3 each)

Term – 3 years

Duties – Review the funds of the Association and audit all bills.
Perform other duties prescribed by the President and examine the books annually.

The President, Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer will be required to maintain and submit a monthly report, recording days and hours worked within the office. In addition, all Association activities or events attended outside of the office should be detailed. The above positions will not be eligible for sick time, vacation time or mileage/gas expense for travel to or from the office. There will be no excused or unexcused absences for elected personnel, although a make-up provision is available with approval of the Executive Board.

RDPFFA 2026 Election Rules

Only Active Members are eligible to run for office, Associate Members are not eligible to run, or vote in elections. Candidates are not eligible to run for more than one elected position within the Association, Candidates may be nominated for any number of positions, but may, only accept and run for one position.

Nominations for offices will open on September 2, 2025 and will close on October 6, 2025, at the General Membership Meeting. Candidates for office may have their names entered into nomination during the nomination period at the RDPFFA office or at the October 2025 General Membership meetings.

The Chairman/Representative of the Election Committee will take Nominations from the floor at the September and October General Meetings. At the October General Meeting the Election Committee Chairman/Representative will close the nominations for all offices. For a Candidate to have his/her name appear on the election ballot, he/she must accept the nomination in writing within 5 business days of the close of nominates.

Following the close of the acceptance period, the Election Committee will cause the election ballot to be prepared, and insure that all Candidates listed have accepted the nomination, and that all Candidates are current Active Members of the Association. If only one Candidate has been nominated for an office and has accepted the nomination, then the Candidate will be considered elected, and no election shall take place for that position.

Ballots will be mailed to all currently listed active members on November 3, 2025; along with the ballot a specially printed return envelope will be included. In order for a ballot to count it must be returned to the RDPFFA office by November 17, 2025, and must be returned in the specially designated return envelope. As election return envelopes are received at the RDPFFA office, the envelopes will be counted, remain sealed and placed in a lock box designed for such purpose by the Election Committee.

Voided ballots will be kept separately; the Election Committee will count and tally the ballots prior to the December General Membership Meeting. During the ballot count observers will be allowed as well as candidates or their designated representative. It shall be the duty of the Election Committee Chairman to provide instructions and appoint personnel to count ballots.

The Committee at their discretion may recount any or all ballots cast. Any candidates may request the Committee to conduct a recount in any disputed position for which they were candidates within 7 calendar days of the December General Meeting. The request to the Election Chairman must be in writing and signed by the candidate making the request. Recount requests shall not be honored by the Committee if their total count for any office being contested shall show an identical count total for two consecutive tallies. All election results will be announced prior to the end of the December General Membership meeting. All ballots will be maintained at the RDPFFA office for a minimum of 60 days following the election.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROCEDURE

Communications vary whether the member was Police, Fire, or Sergeant and above. If you are Police, make your first call to the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association, (313) 870-9304. Followed by either a call to the Detroit Police Officer Association, (313) 567-8770, or the Lieutenants & Sergeants (313) 961-5699, which ever applies.

While the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association will normally contact the City of Detroit with the information, it would be reasonable to follow up with a call to the Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 or 1 (800) 339-8344 and BeneSys at (833) 725-5336 to make sure that they were notified. Last but not least, notify the Retired Detroit Police & Fire Fighters Association at (586) 795-1734.

Fire employees, start by notifying the Detroit Fire Fighter Association, (313) 962-7546, the Detroit Firemen's Fund Association and Detroit Fire Mutual Fund, (313) 628-0099, and the Police and Fire Retirement System (PFRS), (313) 224-3362 or 1 (800) 339-8344, extension 221 and BeneSys at (833) 725-5336

The above agencies will assist you with the notification process. It would be a good idea to put this information with your secured legal documents or some other obvious place where your survivors can locate it.
