General Membership Meeting Notice

I hope everyone enjoyed the holiday season and had a great time with family and friends. Happily New Year to all. All the snow birds that fled Michigan to escape the cold, it seems you may have left a little early. So far this winter the Michigan weather hasn't been too bad. Here it is in early January and haven't had to shovel any snow yet. Hopefully the warmer than normal weather will continue, but we may pay for it with a late spring.

New Pension Tax laws, when you get around to filing your income tax this year remember there is a new Michigan Pension Tax Law. Under the new law, Police and Fire retirees Pension/Retirement income is totally tax free for the state of Michigan. All other retirees have a 4 year phase in. You can still file your tax under the old method or use the new. Under the old you got a deduction of \$35,000 for single \$55,000 if filing joint return, and \$70,000 if both retired from govern-

mental agency that did not participate in Federal Social Security. After you reached age 67 these deductions were allowed on any income not just retirement. Under the new method there is no limit on the amount you can deduct, but it is on retirement/Pension income only. So, I suggest when you do your taxes, that you make sure whoever you go to, is familiar with the new Michigan law, and police and fire tax deductions.

Federal legislation regarding Social Security's Windfall and Pension Offset; a number of members have been calling regarding H.R. 82 of 2023 which would overturn these issues. There has been legislation on these issues ever-since it was enacted and as you know nothing has ever come from it. H.R. 82, of 2023 has the number of co-sponsors (currently 301) that would require the full House of Representatives to take up the issue if the Ways and Means Committee does not take any action. This is the same situation we saw in the last legislative session, and the Ways and Means Committee did just enough so that the Full House of Representatives would not have to take any action, and they will likely do the same thing again. We will continue to monitor this legislation just in case something does happen and will let you know.

Covid, if you are still testing yourself or other family members and looking for the test kits, you can still receive free ones through the US post office and some

The following is the Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighters Associations previous year activities, income and expenses from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023.

A direct quote from the Restated Bylaws of the Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighters Association states, in part, "The purposes of the Association shall be: To provide the Members with information concerning the status of Pensions, Hospitalization and Insurances." The organization achieves pension issue goals by supporting two elected pension representatives, one fire and one police, who in return report to the membership on all relevant activities. Hospitalization Benefits, are regularly monitored by elected Trustees, three are RDPFFA Board of Director members who report to the participants all applicable information.

Additionally, the Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighters Association objective is to promote a spirit of good fellowship and a closer personal relationship among members and their families. Attempting to accomplish this goal the Association arranges an annual picnic and coordinates a golf outing. The Association is organized and shall be operated exclusively for the purposes set forth in Section 501(c) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code.

This is a summary of year end numbers compiled by the Retired Detroit Police Fire Fighters Association Secretary-Treasurer. Over 4,500 persons were participants in the Association at the end of 2023, of those included, 3,917 started the year on payroll deduction

and the Association ended the year with 3,801 on payroll deduction. Other members are those not enrolled who pay annually along with persons not eligible for automatic payroll deduction. The following list represents categories identifying annual expenses; Events \$6,950 (14 donations), General Membership Meetings \$10,094., Honorariums \$36,135, Insurance \$4,927. (Average yearly cost - 3 year policies), Office Expenses \$23,435, Payroll Expenses \$112,821, Professional Fees \$30,000, Professional Services \$8,664, Property Taxes \$8,363, Unity Magazine \$13,857 and Utilities \$11,282 along with a variety of categorized operating cost of \$6,426. Investment expenses are not included.

The yearly Retired Detroit Police and Fire Fighters Association expenses as of December 31, 2023 were \$330,783. The Association had a total income of \$201,074; this number includes \$148,398 in dues, \$24,495 in appreciation and \$28,181 in other income. The dues assessment of \$36.00 annually does not cover the Association's annual expenses which then, are supplemented by transferring investment funds. In 2023, \$120,000 of investment earnings was transferred to the Association's fund to deal with expenditures.

December 31, 2022 total expenses was \$338,283, December 31, 2021 end of the year total expenses was \$261,118, December 31, 2020 end of the year total expenses was \$254,441, December 31, 2019 end of the year total expenses was \$261,402.

Left out from the above values of total assets is the office located at 2525 E. 14 Mile Road Sterling Heights, Michigan 48310-5969 which is owned by the organization. The above numbers are calculations for members' informational purposes only and are not to be construed as a professional audit and official certified numbers.

Retirees born between 1946 and 1952 are entitled to an increased deduction on their Michigan Tax Return. This could result in additional \$650.00 per year.

Also, Retirees born after 1952 and retired before January 1, 2013 are entitled to a deduction on their State of Michigan return which may result in up to \$2,000.00 per year.

Michigan allows you to amend tax returns for 4 years.
